


Are you on a long line?



Your cabinet is enabled for fibre, but unfortunately your premises are too far from the cabinet to benefit from an uplift to superfast speeds. (This is often called having a 'long line').

This is because the last part of the fibre journey is over the existing infrastructure and there is a distance limitation on the technology. The distance from the cabinet to your property has to be no more than 1.2 km - this is measured according to how the infrastructure cables run not as the crow flies. The graph below will give you an idea of distance vs speed.

However that doesn't mean that you may not get some benefit – you may still be able to realise an uplift in speed. This won't be a superfast speed (defined as above 24 Mbps) but you may get a higher speed than you presently get on basic broadband by connecting to the new fibre service.



Please be aware not all ISPs offer a fibre uplift service that is not 'superfast' so you may need to research options through different providers.

In order to do this you will need to speak with your choice of Internet Service Provider (ISP). Below is how you should order broadband if you are on a long line getting above 5Mbps:

Contact your ISP

When you speak to them inform them that; "The telecoms cabinet my property is connected to is now enabled with fibre broadband access. I understand I cannot access 'superfast' speeds because of a line distance limitation issue. Do you have a non-superfast fibre broadband service of 5-15Mbps?" Yes or no?

If 'no' - research the internet and check Ofcom accredited websites for other fibre broadband service providers who do offer a 5-15Mbps fibre broadband service, www.ofcom.org.uk, www.broadbandchoices.co.uk or www.broadband.co.uk.

To our knowledge there are three suppliers who provide this service, although there may be other alternative providers:
